



OPENING EVENT: MENOPAUSE IN ONE DAY

On October 26, 2023, 120+ women gathered to learn about menopause, an often unspoken subject. Dr. Miranda Harris-Glocker was our fantastic speaker, sharing insights into what women can expect during this phase of life and information about the variety of treatment options available to people experiencing menopause. The event was a perfect mix of educational and fun, with a vast array of salty and sweet snacks, specialty cocktails like "the hot flash", and menopause survival kits. Attendees also wrote letters to their elected officials advocating for the inclusion of hormone replacement therapy in Medicaid coverage. It's worth noting that shortly after our event, the White House announced its Initiative on Women's Health Research, which is aimed at funding research specifically targeted at improving health outcomes for women in all areas, ranging from heart attacks to menopause. Kudos to NCJW GRS President Ellie Rosenbloom for spearheading this fabulous event, and to our tireless committee for the hours of research and planning that went into this wonderful evening.
